TDCJ State Chaplain's Forum (March 11-15)

Once again, we were privileged to represent NewLife Behavior and Kings Crossing Prison Ministries at the statewide Chaplain's Forum. Only a handful of ministry efforts are allowed to give presentations due to their statewide impact on TDCJ. NLBM curriculum is in more than half of the 100 prison units in Texas (probably much higher with Bible Correspondence courses).

Our relationships with chaplains is strong. **Dale Underwood** (pictured below) and others will be traveling throughout the state in the coming months to prisons (Navasota, El Paso, Fort Stockton, Plainview, San Antonio, Houston, and more) and increase the influence for Christ in prisons through NLBM curriculum usage. KCPM has been asked to go into the Garza East facility in Beeville (just opened back up due to TDCJ increased numbers). Next week (April 6th), we will once again return to the Glossbrenner Unit in San Diego, TX for preaching and a mass baptism event. Last October saw 52 men baptized into Christ! *Please continue to pray that God blesses these efforts so that souls (like* James Glover; *above) are won and serve!*
